Thanks, support for vets

Last Saturday, **Miller's Vets** launched the latest expression of its steadfast commitment to supporting those who have served their country.

The goal is to ensure that all area deceased veterans receive full military honors.

Miller founded Miller's Vets in an effort to help restore their sense of dignity and pride.

A group of 14 has been trained to perform honor guard duties at funerals for local veterans organizations.

This program continues the work started several years ago by Robert Miller Sr., a former St. Joseph Superior Court judge and retired lieutenant commander in the U.S. Naval Reserves. Haunted by the plight of homeless veterans, Miller founded Miller's Vets in an effort to help restore their sense of dignity and pride.

Since then, the Last Salute was established to provide free funerals and military burials to homeless and indigent veterans, and a veterans center bearing his name offers housing and critical support.
